

Death of Dr. Grave.

Dr. Frances Graves was born in Montgomery county, Mo., May 28, 1849, died July 4th 1905, in his 57th year. He professed faith in Christ and was baptized at the age of 15 years at Zion Baptist church, Montgomery county. On Dec. 16 '68 he was happily married to Miss Fannie Jefferson of Montgomery county, who survives him. To this union were born 11 children 9 of whom are living, viz: Mrs. W. I. Woodson, Mrs. Anna Hart Misses Francis and Katherine Graves, James W., Booker S., Dorsett V., Charles E., David B. He also leaves a brother, Rev. D. W. Graves, who is well known in Montgomery. He lost a son, William A. about 10 months ago. Dr. Graves has been a practicing physician in Montgomery county for 27 years. For a number of years he has been associated in his practice with his nephew Dr. David Nowlin. He was ordained to the office of deacon in the Baptist church of this city about 10 yrs. ago which office he held at the time of his death. Brother Graves was one of the most widely known and best loved men in Montgomery county. He led a consistent, prayerful Christian life, and was loyal to his church and pastor. He will be greatly missed by pastor and people, as well as the entire community. It can truly be said of him, that he was big hearted, generous, companionable with his children, a kind and affectionate father and devoted husband. The funeral service was conducted at the Baptist Church, by the Pastor Thursday morning July 6th at 10:00 o'clock, in the presence of a large gathering of sorrowing relatives and friends.
