

In the name of God upon the first day of April one thousand seven hundred and ninety two I Bridget Beazley of Buckingham County being sick and weak of body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to God therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die to make and ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I recommend my soul into the hands of God who gave it and as for my body I recommend it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same by the Mighty Power of God and touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life I give and dispose of the same in the following manner and form Expressly: I give and bequeath unto my beloved son August Beazley the tract or parcel of land that I bought of him it being the land willed to him by his father John Beazley also one negro girl named Kelifa and one mare colt called Pella. Next I give unto my son Hediam Beazley the tract of land which I bought of James Beazley it being the land willed to him by his father John Beazley also one negro boy named Peter and horse colt by the name of Dorick. Item I give to my beloved daughter Mary Palmer one negro girl named Nance during her life and at her decease to her daughter Nancy Palmer. I also give to Susanna Robertson one good feather bed and one cotton wheel by them freely to be possessed and enjoyed, and if there should be any thing against a provision of my husbands estate my will is that it may be divided amongst my other children

Wm. William Beazley, John Beazley, James Beazley,  
Wmmy Keurt and Sally Cason and I do likewise constitute  
and ordain my son William Beazley and Nixon Palmer  
my only and sole Executors of this my last will and Testa-  
ment and I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke and disannul  
and all and every other testaments, Wills, Legacies, bequests and  
executors by me named ratifying and confirming this and  
no other to be my last Will and Testament. In witness  
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the  
day and year above mentioned.

At a Court held for Buckingham County the 11<sup>th</sup> day of  
February 1793 This Will was proved by the oath of Thomas  
Wood one of the witnesses thereto and at another Court  
held for said County the 8<sup>th</sup> April 1793 This will was  
further proved by the oath of Thomas Woolbridge and  
James Beaton the other witnesses thereto and ordered to be  
recorded. and at the same Court continued and held  
the ninth day of April 1793 was sworn to by Nixon  
Palmer one of the Executors herein mentioned and an Oath  
matian of the said Exr. who entered into an acknowledged  
bond with security according to law sufficient was granted  
him for obtaining a probat in due form and liberty reserved  
to the other exrs. to join in the probat hereafter when he shall  
think proper.
